
Marble is a completely natural stone, and the veins on its surface are formed as minerals settle amongst the

quartz and neolith, marble is porous and can be stained. Sealing marble once a year will help to minimise the amount of staining but it might give

completely maintenance-free surface. GENERAL WEAR AND TEAR Marble is a softer stone in comparison to the likes of natural granite or engineered quartz, so it is more susceptible to scratches, dents and chips over time. So it's something to take into account if you are
